Adaptation event

Cooling Centers

Because of the recent heat wave in the area, regional heating centers are needed. Suggestions for potential cooling centers are: the Kirkland Art Center Gallery, the Senior Center in Clark Mills, the Kirkland Town Library, Clinton Central School Administrative Building, Hamilton College buildings. These groups need to be contacted and agree to take part. They would need to have extended hours and increased staffing. Then the Village and Town would need to be notified and it would be advertised.
